Spread over five hectares, the joint Indo-US plant is located in one of the most industrially backward areas of Andhra Pradesh. But it is an area rich in high-quality clay- the main raw material in the manufacture of quality ceramic tiles.

The clay used by Spartek is really sediment deposits which collect at the bottom of irrigation tanks and village ponds. 'Most villages in this region,' says Tripuraneni, the Managing Director of Spartek Ceramics, 'have irrigation tanks that fill up during the rainy season. During the summer months the rain water is used by the people, leaving behind fine red clay. In mining this clay, we also help desilt the tanks so that farmers can use them again.'

'The clay is right for the making of tiles. It has the right strength, the right plasticity – in fact all the essential properties that Ceramic US insisted it must have to make first- rate tiles,' he said.

The Spartek kiln is by all accounts the most advanced of its kind. It uses liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), one of the cleanest fuels. Many tile plants in India run on furnace oil or coal, both of which affect the quality of tiles. Oil has sulphur in it and coal has tar and ash content which interfere with colour quality. Moreover, sulphur reacts with the chemicals used for glazing tiles, and this leaves a patchy effect and pin holes in the tiles. That is why most overseas manufacture of tiles of international quality have switched over to gas-fired kilns.

Another advantage of an LPG kiln is its fuel efficiency. We save about seventy per cent in fuel expenditure, which is the single biggest cost component in tiles. In the manufacture of tiles roughly fifty percent of the cost is accounted for by the fuel. This saving gives a vital cost advantage.

The idea of generating energy from the electrochemical compound of hydrogen and oxygen can be traced back more than 150 years to the British physicist Sir William Robert Grove (1811-1896). He constructed a battery which could generate energy directly from hydrogen and oxygen. Though he improved his design, his invention did not catch on.

Daimler Benz of Germany is the first company in the world to introduce a road-worthy electronic car which does not draw its energy from storage batteries, but obtains it directly from a chemical reaction between hydrogen and air. The energy is generated by means of fuel cells which are fed by two hydrogen tanks. This enables a large passenger car in the new V-class Mercedes to accommodate and transport six passengers for a distance of approximately 250 km on a full tank. More importantly it is eco-friendly and noiseless.

The electronic motor under the bonnet purrs so soft that it is drowned by the other sounds such as those made by the wheels and the wind current. Even the energy generator the fuel cell is silent. Occasionally only vapour. There are no traces of any environmentally harmful nitric oxide and soot particles or carbon dioxide which are responsible for the greenhouse effect. The fuel cells used in these cars is a true alternative to petroleum-based fuels.

The work of the heart can never be interrupted. The heart's job is to keep oxygen rich blood flowing through the body. All the body's cells need a constant supply of Oxygen, especially those in the brain. The brain cells like only four to five minutes after their oxygen is cut off, and death comes to the entire body.

The heart is a specialized muscle that serves as a pump. This pump is divided into four chambers connected by tiny doors called valves. The chambers work to keep the blood flowing round the body in a circle.

At the end of each circuit, veins carry the blood to the right atrium, the first of the four chambers. 2/5 oxygen by then is used up and it is on its way back to the lung to pick up a fresh supply and to give up the carbon dioxide it has accumulated. From the right atrium the blood flows through the tricuspid valve into the second chamber, the right ventricle. The right ventricle contracts when it is filled, pushing the blood through the pulmonary artery, which leads to the lungs – in the lungs the blood gives up its carbon dioxide and picks up fresh oxygen. Then it travels to the third chamber the left atrium. When this chamber is filled it forces the blood through the a valve to the left ventricle. From here it is pushed into a big blood vessel called aorta and sent round the body by way of arteries.

Heart disease can result from any damage to the heart muscle, the valves or the pacemaker. If the muscle is damaged, the heart is unable to pump properly. If the valves are damaged blood cannot flow normally and easily from one chamber to another, and if the pacemaker is defective, the contractions of the chambers will become un-coordinated.

Until the twentieth century, few doctors dared to touch the heart. In 1953 all this changed after twenty years of work, Dr. John Gibbon in the USA had developed a machine that could take over temporarily from the heart and lungs. Blood could be routed through the machine bypassing the heart so that surgeons could work inside it and see what they were doing. The era of open heart surgery had begun.

The refers to the ongoing economic liberalisation, initiated in 1991, of the country's economic policies, with the goal of making the economy more market-oriented and expanding the role of private and foreign investment. Specific changes include a reduction in import tariffs, deregulation of markets, reduction of taxes, and greater foreign investment. Liberalisation has been credited by its proponents for the high economic growth recorded by the country in the 1990s and 2000s. Its opponents have blamed it for increased poverty, inequality and economic degradation. The overall direction of liberalisation has since remained the same, irrespective of the ruling party, although no party has yet solved a variety of politically difficult issues, such as

liberalising labour laws and reducing agricultural subsidies. There exists a lively debate in India as to what made the economic reforms sustainable.

Indian government coalitions have been advised to continue liberalisation. India grows at slower pace than China, which has been liberalising its economy since 1978. *The McKinsey Quarterly* states that removing main obstacles "would free India's economy to grow as fast as China's, at 10% a year". There has been significant debate, however, around liberalisation as an inclusive economic growth strategy. Since 1992, income inequality has deepened in India with consumption among the poorest staying stable while the wealthiest generate consumption growth. As India's gross domestic product (GDP) growth rate became lowest in 2012-13 over a decade, growing merely at 5.1%, more criticism of India's economic reforms surfaced, as it apparently failed to address employment growth, nutritional values in terms of food intake in calories, and also exports growth - and thereby leading to a worsening level of current account deficit compared to the prior to the reform period. But then in FY 2013-14 the growth rebounded to 6.9% and then in 2014-15 it rose to 7.3% as a result of the reforms put by the New Government which led to the economy becoming healthy again and the current account deficit coming in control. Growth reached 7.5% in the Jan-Mar quarter of 2015 before slowing to 7.0% in Apr-Jun quarter. Indian economic policy after independence was influenced by the colonial experience (which was seen by Indian leaders as exploitative in nature) and by those leaders' exposure to Fabian socialism. Policy tended towards protectionism, with a strong emphasis on import substitution, industrialisation under state monitoring, state intervention at the micro level in all businesses especially in labour and financial markets, a large public sector, business regulation, and central planning. Five-Year Plans of India resembled central planning in the Soviet Union. Steel, mining, machine tools, water, telecommunications, insurance, and electrical plants, among other industries, were effectively nationalised in the mid-1950s. Elaborate licences, regulations and the accompanying red tape, commonly referred to as Licence Raj, were required to set up business in India between 1947 and 1990.
